What is a Cloverbud?

Any child ages 5, 6, or 7 who would like to start to explore the county's 4-H program. The Cloverbud project will help its members enhance development and learning through fun, hands-on activities. It is a noncompetitive, participatory program that encourages the children to learn by doing in order to build self-confidence, expand interests and encourage creativity. The program

enables children to explore different areas of the 4-H program, build self-esteem through fun experiences, and enhance their social skills.



What will we accomplish this year?

Mostly, we will have fun! Discovery and learning-by-doing will be our goal in our time together. Our sessions will be a mixture of crafts, learning games, activities, experiments, demonstrations from other areas of 4-H, and recording what they learned.

How do we register for the Cloverbud program?

First, all Cloverbuds need to join a club. You may either join the Cloverbud club or any other 4-H club that has a Cloverbud program. The club leader will then lead you through the process of registration. All Cloverbuds are invited to attend the Cloverbud club meetings even if they belong to another 4-H club.
