Pollinator Habitat Resource Guide

- This guide is a collaborative effort between CSU Extension Boulder County, Longmont & Boulder Valley Conservation Districts and the Natural Resources Conservation Service.
- Our aim is to provide area residents with up-to-date, research based information on how to best create habitat on their property. Whether you have a small patio garden with a few pots or live on a small acreage property you can provide robust habitat that will support the pollinators in your area.
- Habitat loss is currently one of the major threats to pollinators. Fragmentation (areas of
 habitat that are broken into small and separate parts) and degradation (poor quality
 habitat) also play a key role. By increasing, connecting and improving the quality of existing
 habitat we can all work together to create a landscape fabric that supports these important
 species.
- Some key things to keep in mind are pollinators need food, water, shelter and space to
 thrive. By incorporating appropriate plant species, water sources, areas of cover and
 providing as much space as possible in your landscape for pollinators, you can have a big
 impact on the livelihoods of the animals and insects that provide such an important
 ecosystem service.
