4-H Giving During this Time of Need



We know that 4-Hers have a heart of gold and it is natural to want to give to our communities during these tragic times. Your club may be discussing ways to support our impacted neighbors these next few months, but there are some regulations to keep in mind when it comes to the use of Club funds. Here is some guidance to ensure the appropriate guidelines and federal regulations for nonprofit status of the National 4-H program are met.

Federal regulations specify that all money raised by 4-H clubs using the 4-H Name and Emblem must be used for educational activities for 4-H members. This means money must be used to pay for educational programs, activities, workshops, or 4-H club supplies.

Unless specific steps are taken, it is not appropriate for 4-H club funds to be used for noneducational activities, including donations to other organizations. If a club wishes to raise funds to donate to a specific cause, all publicity and signage must clearly state the money raised may be or will be donated to another organization. The public must be informed that their contribution does not directly support the 4-H club conducting the fundraiser.

Wording is important when creating promotional materials for a fundraiser. "All proceeds will be donated/used for" means all the money raised will be donated. "All profits will be donated/used for" allows the club to deduct expenses of the fundraiser from the money raised.

EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE – *There are many ways to make what we do educational for our members!*

4-H club funds must be used for educational purposes. Spending club funds can be educational by involving youth in the activity planning, setup, coordination, execution, etc. Members can learn many life skills in the process. It can also be a significant bonding and team building experience for all involved. In the following examples, the focus is educational when youth drive the process.

Example 1: Youth design the county fair booth decorations, purchase supplies, and buy pizza for members to enjoy while making the decorations and creating the booth display. This activity utilizes creative arts skills and teamwork and leadership.

Example 2: 4-H members want to hold a party during a monthly meeting. Members plan the fun, educational, and business components of the meeting. This activity builds leadership skills, food preparation skills, and consumer management skills.

Example 3: 4-H club members have researched community needs and determined that a fundraiser with contributions going to an organization will help fulfill the 4-H pledge of "larger service to my community." This activity grows leadership and civic engagement skills. The group plans a fundraiser and displays signs stating the money goes to a direct cause.

⇒ Understanding Emotions To Abnormal Events

Wildfires can be particularly stressful because the factors that influence their strength and direction can change at any moment. Communities that seem clear of danger can suddenly need to evacuate. Despite well-orchestrated and persistent fire fighting by emergency services personnel, sometimes destruction of life and property is unpreventable. It is common for people who have lived through these circumstances to experience strong emotions. Understanding normal responses to these abnormal events can aid you in coping effectively with your feelings, thoughts and behaviors as you recover from the fire.

Enrollment

⇒ 4-H ENROLLMENT Deadline January 28th!

Any youth age 5-18 years as of December 31, 2021 may join. Children ages 5-7 enroll in the Cloverbud project, which explores a variety of 4-H topics and is noncompetitive. Youth ages 8-18 enroll in 4-H projects of their choice.

Online enrollment for the new 4-H year 2021-22 is open.

Go to www.V2.4HOnline.com

- Each family will login using their family email address and password to enroll electronically. If you don't remember your family email to start this process, please get with your Organizational Leader to verify your family email.
- Confirm your projects in each 4-H member and the clubs they are enrolled in. Please note to remove any projects that automatically rolled over from the other years.
- Take a screenshot or save your enrollment.
- The only paperwork you will have to print out is the Animal Care and Housing Form if your animals are located at a different property.
- Step by step instructions to help you enroll are posted on the Boulder County 4-H website www.boulder4h.org.

Enrollment Fee Schedule:

- **4-H Member Enrollment—\$40.00.** Late fee for returning members if after last Friday in January - **\$20.00**
- **Cloverbud Enrollment—\$40.00**
- **Separate charge for manuals. Please consult your Organizational Leader**
- **Shooting Sports fee - \$20.00 fee payable to your club leaders along with t-shirt size.** Please continue to monitor the Shooting Sports program for State issued changes.
- **Second Club enrollment— no additional fee**
- **Family maximum payment for enrollment — \$ 120.00.** Late fee for returning families if after last Friday in January - **\$180.00**
- **Leaders** - Current Leaders—no charge; New Leaders — \$5.00 for background check
- **Scholarships** - There are needs-based enrollment scholarships available upon request. Applications can be found at Boulder4H.org, Enroll in 4-H; or contact the Extension office for details.
- Members and Leaders will be "active" in 4-H Online once the forms and fees have been turned in by the Club Leader to the Extension Office.

Payments:

- Payment will go through your 4-H Club Leader either by cash, check or [Eventbrite](https://www.eventbrite.com) — our online payment option.
- Payment must be received from your club to the 4-H Office by the deadline, so please plan ahead and help your leaders out by getting payment completed early.
- 4-H Leaders: Please be sure to keep payments in three different checks from your club:
 - 4-H Enrollment- payable to Boulder County Extension
 - 4-H Dog Fees- Payable to BC4H Dog Advisory
 - 4-H Shooting Sports Fees- Payable to BC4HSSC (shooting sports council)

Deadlines:

- Re-enrolling members need to enroll and pay prior to the last Friday in January—**January 28, 2022**. After this deadline there is a \$20 late fee for re-enrolling members.
- Last Friday in April – is the final deadline for all 4-H enrollments to be eligible to participate at the Boulder County Fair—**April 29, 2022**



General Projects 4-H

⇒ Foods and Nutrition Projects

Enroll in a Foods and nutrition project to learn more about kitchen and food safety, basic food preparation and nutrition, baking, food preservation methods, outdoor cooking, party planning, and ethnic food options. Foods Info night will be March 15, more information coming in February.

Project Options include:

Cooking 101 - Learn the basic skills of food preparation, selection, and safety and learn to make cookies and simple snacks

Cooking 201- Expand on basic skills and learn to make quick breads, scones, or muffins

Cooking 301 - Plan and prepare food for a party, learn how to make yeast breads and rolls, bake shortened cakes, cook with slow cookers, and prepare food on a grill

Cooking 401 - Prepare ethnic foods, bake flatbreads and ethnic breads, make candy, bake pastries, bake foam cakes, use dry-and moist-heat cooking methods, and plan and prepare celebration meals.

Outdoor Cooking & Living - Learn what foods are good for camping and outdoor cooking in terms of weight, packaging, and nutrient density

Cultural and Ethnic Foods - Learn about the different dietary patterns of an ethnic and/or cultural group so you can plan, prepare and serve different ethnic and/or cultural meals

Passport to Foreign Cookery - Select a foreign country or ethnic group and study their food habits, customs, nutritional aspects of their diet, religion, geography and maps, menus, and recipes



Shooting Sports News

⇒ Shooting Sports Practice Schedule

Before you can shoot ANY discipline, you must attend a safety class given by a 4-H certified instructor per discipline. A 2022 4-H shooting card will then be provided with the instructor's signature & date. Then to complete the card you will need at least 5 safe shooting practices with signatures/dated from a certified 4-H shooting instructor per discipline before the BCF shoot to compete.

In order to compete at county or State shoots you will also need to have proof that you completed the CO Hunter Safety Course (copy of Hunters Safety Card needs to be on file). **You may practice without completing the CO Hunter Safety Course**, but you must have completed the CO Hunter Safety Course to compete in shooting competitions. This portion is NOT provided by 4-H, but here is where you can schedule for a CO Hunter Safety Course: <https://cpw.state.co.us/learn/Pages/HE-Traditional-Classes.aspx>

Only shooters who have completed a 2022 Safety Class from a certified 4-H SS leader may participate in the shooting practices. All in-person practice dates are tentative and must be county approved. All shooters, leaders, and guardians intending to be present on the shooting range must sign up to attend **each practice** due to Covid. Once you've completed a county-wide 2022 Safety Class per discipline, a Sign Up Genius or equivalent sign up requirement will arrive to you through email for **each** practice date.

- Rifle (Air & 22) & Pistol (Air & 22) Safety class
