| Masters<br>Division | Master<br>Showman  | This class is for exhibitors who are age 11–18 as of<br>December 31 of the current 4-H year (Intermediates and<br>Seniors) who have won the Grand Champion or Reserve<br>Grand Champion in Intermediate or Senior Showmanship at<br>a previous State 4-H Dog Trial. | Once an exhibitor has won Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Master<br>Showman, Senior Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Showman, or<br>Intermediate Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Showman, they are<br>required to show in the Master Showman class for their remaining years<br>as a 4-H exhibitor.  |

\* Counties are encouraged to follow the 4-H State Dog Trails rules as closely as possible. Please note that some counties may have differences and it is important that exhibitors learn both their county and state rules to ensure success in qualifying for the 4-H State Dog Trails at State Fair. Counties have the discretion for class placement. However, 4-H State Dog Trial rules may prohibit eligibility for 4-H State Dog Trial entry.
