- Exhibitors, enrolled in a 4-H Horse Project, must show their own project horse(s)
- All classes except those marked "Open" qualify for the Boulder County 4-H HLC year-end high point award.
- Helmets are required for all unrated riders and level I riders, recommended for all others
- The equitation/horsemanship classes will be a pattern only, except walk/trot(jog) and unrated, which will be rail only.
- Exhibitors must compete at their 4-H riding level test passed
- Management may elect to combine classes with 3 or fewer entries or split classes with a lot
 of entries
- Entries in classes 7,8,24 & 25 may not participate in any class that canters or lopes
- Proceeds benefit Blazing Saddles 4-H youth.
