

A Hunter Education Course is scheduled here, April 4th -6th !



To compete at the County Fair Shoot for ALL disciplines you must have a Hunters Education Card up-loaded online. If you have not completed this course, you will have a chance to sign up to get it done. You only need to complete this course once in your lifetime. All enrolled Shooting Sports members will have the link blasted to them when it becomes available (soon), but anyone can request the link to sign up. The course may have a \$10 fee and must be paid in cash on the first day of class. Everyone must attend all 3 days & complete a written test and live fire to receive



their Hunters Safety Card. If you're not enrolled in a SS project you may request the sign-up link from Lisa Wallace lwallace@bouldercounty.org This class is NOT open to the public as we've requested it to be for 4-H families only and may be open to other neighboring 4-H counties later to fill the class.

If the April dates do not fit your schedule, you can find a class at the CPW site that may (see below link). Online classes are also available for a higher fee and you must still schedule a class for the live fire (additional fee). In person classes fill quickly so don't delay too long to schedule a class. The County shoots are mid-July so you must have completed a Hunters Ed class by shoot time. All Hunters Education in person classes consist of (including our April class): Students complete the course in a classroom setting that includes lectures, hands-on activities, videos, a written test and a live fire exercise. All students must demonstrate safe firearm handling skills through the live-fire exercise. The rifles and ammunition are supplied by Colorado Parks and Wildlife; personal firearms cannot be used for the live fire exercise. The course costs up to \$10 and requires a minimum of 10 hours of class time that may be split into two or more days. Depending on the instructor's preference, a parent or guardian may be required to attend with a minor.
